NMPBS Community Cinema series presents *The Graduates/Los Graduados* screening on September **25.** The Graduates explores pressing issues in education today through the eyes of six young Latino and Latina students from across the United State. More than a survey of contemporary policy debates; viewers gain a first-hand perspective on the different challenges facing Latino high school students and their families, educators and community leaders. The Graduates is not only a story about how Latino students are faring in our nation's public education system, it is also a story about the graduates who will make up America's future.

There will be an Bilingual screening of the two-part, two-hour documentary. Hour one focuses on boys and young men while hour two focuses on girls and young women. Laurel asked for input for the discussion panel and who the target audience should be to screen the documentary. There was discussion that we should find someone who has persevered and can offer their experience. Also, it was felt the audience should have some groupings of charter schools to plant the seed and to invite the parents who endured those hardships. Another suggestion made included the idea that students should bring an adult/mentor that has made a difference to them. A discussion followed the suggestion that we target middle schoolers and bus them in similar to a field trip or screen it at a school but, it was felt that it should be an out of school activity held in the evening with peers and family.

NMPBS will participate in American Graduate Day 2013 on September 28. It is a live broadcast and community engagement event dedicated to helping all students stay on the path to high school graduation and future success in college and career. Broadcast and streamed nationally from the Tisch WNET Studios at Lincoln Center in New York City, the seven-hour special highlights community partners, educators, youth, and celebrities involved in education and youth intervention programs to help keep at-risk students in school. Content strands include Early Learning, Career Readiness and College Completion, STEM, More and Better Learning Time, Dropout Recovery and Prevention, Mentoring and Family Support. Big Brothers Big Sisters, Boys & Girls Clubs of America, City Year, Horizons National, and United Way are among the community partners participating.

- O What can parents do?

• Students:

- O What are some of the family issues that keep kids from school?
- O Do you know someone who is skipping? What are their reasons?
- O What are the barriers to keeping your classmates in school?

- O What are kids doing when they skip school?
- Do you feel peer pressure to not go to school?
- o Do teachers encourage you to stay in school?
- o Is there an adult at school who cares about your success in school?

Small group breakout to discuss Focus Group Report and propose questions for community forums

- Student questions that should be proposed are:
 - First Group: What makes you want to go to school? What makes you not want to go to school?
 - Second Group: How do you perceive truancy and who is to be held responsible?
 - O What resources can improve?
 - o Third Group: What is the cultural of the school and community? What does family engagement look like to you? What should an ideal school look like?
